Despite minor criticisms, such as intrusive advertising, the positive aspects clearly outweigh the negatives. 4. Algorithm bias: The recommendation system can sometimes lead to a "filter bubble," where users are exposed primarily to content that aligns with their existing views and interests, limiting the diversity of content encountered.

5. Data consumption: Streaming high-quality videos can consume significant amounts of mobile data, which can be a concern for users with limited data plans.
